The dinner meeting on November 17 featured Charlie's splendid pre-Thanksgiving feast and 8 speakers from the Alexandria community offering opportunities for members of the bar to partner with them. It was a packed dinner with 10 guests and 60 bar members. Each community speaker had a few minutes to make their cause and they did—with passion in their speech and brochures on every table.

Our Foundation provides grants to Stop Child Abuse Now (SCAN) to help run their court-appointed special advocates (CASA) but there are more opportunities to be involved. Spring for Alexandria, Habitat for Humanity, Rebuilding Together Alexandria all help with housing issues and offer the opportunity to build, rebuild, or maintain homes with hammers, nails, and paint. SOHO's mentoring program is seeking

meals, help with room renovation, and pro-bono legal consultations. Every year, this bar's Bell Ringing helps Social Services of Alexandria (a city agency) with toys and money for their children's party but, they can always use volunteers to help with their various programs. John Porter spoke about ACT for Alexandria, the organization which raises funds to support community programs in Alexandria City. Senior Services of Alexandria had two representatives, executive director Janet Barnett and Alexandria Bar past-president Barbara Anderson who is also chair of their board of directors. They provide taxi services, Meals on Wheels, money management, in-home assistance and employment counseling among other services and seek volunteers to help within their programs.
