We ended the summer by celebrating the 30th Anniversary of the Alexandria Public Defender's Office. Under the leadership of Melinda Douglas, the office and its alumni are top-tier attorneys who are leaders in their field. We want to thank you for your dedication and service to the ensure access to justice. THIRTY YEARS OF PUBLIC SERVICE—by Alfred D. Swersky, Judge Retired

In June, 1985, when I was sworn in as a Judge of the Circuit Court, criminal defense work was primarily in the hands of a list of attorneys willing to accept court-appointed criminal cases for \$75 for a misdemeanor and \$125 for a felony. While there were many competent trial attorneys on the list, there were problems, not just in Virginia but nationwide. Retained criminal cases were rare. For a couple of years before I took the bench, there was a movement to have a Public Defender's Office, founded by the state and the city.

The plan to have a permanent staff of trial attorneys, experienced in criminal matters, was met with resistance within the Alexandria Bar. While there were some good arguments against establishing such an office (the inherent conflict in a defendant's attorney being hired and paid by the state or the locality for one), most of the opposition was based on the fact that most lawyers in Alexandria either had gotten their start in the community or were then relying on the court-appointed cases as a source of income. Also, working against it was the lawyers' inherent resistance to change.

After some months of effort, a resolution was passed by the Alexandria Bar Association supporting the public defender concept. The City of Alexandria, in the person of City Manager Vola Lawson and Deputy City Manager Michele Evans, was instrumental in pushing the plan and financing the office through local subsidies and locating office space.

On July 1, 1987, the office opened headed by, of course, Melinda Douglas and a staff of three assistants. The Circuit Court, consisting of Judges

Donald H. Kent (Chief Judge), Donald M. Haddock, and me, was fully behind the effort. Even the General District Court (Judges O'Flaherty and Colby) was on board.

After a few bumps along the way, the system was up and running and has been ever since. I had a standing bet of \$100 that anyone who came to court to watch criminal proceedings in Alexandria, who did not know the attorneys, could not distinguish between our public defenders and retained counsel. No one ever took me up on the bet.

Over the years, approximately 46 lawyers have served or are currently serving as assistant public defenders. Many have gone on to illustrious careers in private practice and are among the preeminent criminal trial attorneys in Virginia and elsewhere. Others have become distinguished academics and judges.

It's interesting to note that many of them have remained in public service, continuing to furnish legal services to those unable to afford those services. The private practitioners remain available to accept court-appointed cases when the Public Defender's Office is conflicted out or is backlogged with cases. In fact, I recently appointed three former public defenders to represent the defendant in Alexandria's most serious criminal case in years. The newspapers (and the original judge designated to hear the cases) were complementary of their performance.



Of course, it goes without saying that an overwhelming amount of the credit goes to Melinda Douglas. While she's reticent to admit it, she was and continues to be the prime reason for the ongoing success of this office.

My standing bet is still on the table after 30 years. It's a mortal lock for me.

GREG WADE PROFILE

Greg Wade could be called one of the main repositories of institutional memory within the Alexandria Bar Association. He is a former President of the Alexandria Bar Association, served on the local ethics committee, and was on the City's Private Industry Council.

Greg is an Alexandria, Virginia native, growing up in the Rosemont and Del Ray neighborhoods of the City. When he graduated law school from Loyola University he moved back to Northern Virginia and started practicing law in 1976. After practicing for one year in Fairfax, he quickly moved back to Alexandria the first chance he got. He has stayed actively involved with the Alexandria Bar Association throughout his 40 year career and enjoys the collegial and welcoming atmosphere.

In Alexandria, Greg associated himself with attorney Joe Peters, and when Peters left the private practice of law to become a JDR Judge, Greg and another local attorney, Charles Cox, purchased the office building at 616 N. Washington Street, where Greg continues to practice today with Wade Grimes Friedman Meinken and Leischner.

Greg recalls that in the late 70s and early 80s, their neighbors on Washington Street consisted of a "massage parlor" and an illegal bingo hall, nothing like the Starbucks and Trader Joe's that line the block today. The massage parlor and bingo hall were ultimately shut down thanks to a scandal involving several local lawyers which led to the resignation of the Commonwealth's Attorney at the time. To his credit, Greg was not one of the local lawyers involved in the scandal.



While Greg describes his life as "pretty boring, just trying to avoid mediocrity," many would see him as an adventurous risk-taker. In 1992, after earning a sizable fee in a personal injury case and with, what he calls "an exaggerated idea of my own prosperity," he took a sabbatical from the practice of law and moved his entire family to Spain for a year. He studied Spanish at the University of Granada, learned to ski, travelled around Europe during the kids' school breaks, and engage in "mostly failed" business ventures with an Italian man named Franco who lived down the street. He was fortunate to have cooperative partners at the time, and when he returned, his law practice was there to pick up where he left off.

Greg calls himself an "old-fashioned general practice lawyer." He has always represented people. Greg says fondly, that the great thing about practicing law in Alexandria for forty years is that everywhere he goes, he sees people who he has represented or their family members. He considers it a great privilege to be able to help people going through difficult times. "I think I've impacted a lot of people's lives in Alexandria. That's what we do as lawyers, we help one person at a time, but over a period of years we can make an impact."
